IURRICANE PREPA

HURRICANE SEASON: JUNE 1 - NOVEMBER 30

Living in South Florida means preparing for hurricane season every year. Now is the time to prepare if you haven't already. Whether you're new to the area, have never experienced a hurricane, or have lived in Sunny Isles Beach for many years - this guide will help you prepare, stay safe, and know what to do before, during, and after the storm.

WHAT IS A HURRICANE?

A hurricane is a powerful tropical storm that forms over warm ocean waters. These storms are categorized by wind speed:

Category	Sustained Winds	Types of Damage Due to Hurricane Winds
1	74 -95 mph	Some damage likely
2	96 – 110 mph	Extensive damage possible
3 (Major)	111 – 129 mph	Devastating damage
4 (Major)	130 – 156 mph	Catastrophic damage
5 (Major)	157 mph or higher	Widespread destruction

KNOW YOUR ZONE

Sunny Isles Beach is located in evacuation Zone B.

If a Category 2 hurricane or stronger is approaching, this zone may be ordered to evacuate due to lifethreatening storm surge. Stay alert and be ready to act.

BUILD A HURRICANE KIT

Build an emergency supply kit that can sustain you and your family for 3 – 7 days. A few basics to keep stocked:

- □ 1 gallon of drinking water per person, per day
- ☐ First aid kit
- □ Flashlight
- □ Non-perishable canned and dry foods
- □ Sanitation products

BEFORE THE STORM:

MAKE A PLAN

Evacuation: Know where you'll go if an evacuation order is issued. Your destination doesn't have to be far – just outside of the flood-prone area. For evacuation centers, visit miamidade.gov/hurricane.

Include Pets: Don't leave pets behind. Look for petfriendly shelters at miamidade.gov/animals.

PREPARE YOUR PROPERTY

Trees: Trim trees before hurricane season. Use a certified arborist and never remove more than 25% of the canopy. Clear out branches and schedule bulk pickup.

Storm Drains: Help prevent flooding by keeping leaves, debris, and trash out of drains and streets.

Yards & Balconies: Bring in or secure furniture, planters, and décor that could become projectiles in strong winds.

DURING THE **STORM**:

Stay Connected: Follow updates from the City's website, social media, SIBAlert, local media, and the My Sunny Isles Beach mobile app. Also monitor the storm through our local media including local TV stations and radio.

Include Pets: Don't leave pets behind. Look for pet-friendly shelters at miamidade.gov/animals.

Power Safety: Be ready to turn off electricity if there's flooding or downed power lines.

Water Supply: Fill clean water containers and bathtubs with water.

Electronics: Keep your cell phone and electronics charged.

Community Support: Check with neighbors, especially senior adults or those needing extra help.

Special Needs?

Register in advance for evacuation assistance if you need medical help, transportation, or daily care: call 305.513.7700 or visit miamidade.gov/hurricane.

CO Detector: Check your carbon monoxide detector's battery.

*Report downed power lines or outages to FPL at 1-800-4-OUTAGE (1-800-468-8243). Call 911 for emergencies.

AFTER THE STORM:

Power and Gas: If your home has been damaged, shut off electricity and gas to reduce the risk of fire, electrocution, or explosions.

Floodwater Warning: Never walk or drive through standing water. It may be deeper or more dangerous than it looks.

Downed Power Lines: Stay far away from any downed or exposed wires and report them immediately.

Document Damage: Take photos or videos of your home and belongings to document storm damage. Save all receipts for repairs and cleaning – this is important for insurance claims.

Report Issues: Use the My Sunny Isles Beach mobile app to report flooding and downed trees.

Gas Leaks: If you smell gas or suspect a leak:

- Turn off the main gas valve
- Open windows to let air in
- Leave the house immediately
- Call your gas company from a safe location

Safe Lighting: Use battery-powered flashlights or lanterns. Avoid candles. If you must use them, place them in sturdy holders away from anything flammable.

Prevent Mosquito Breeding: After the storm, empty standing water from anything that collects rainwater.



UPCOMING PUBLIC MEETING FOR NEW SINGLE-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL ORDINANCE CHANGES

JOIN US ON JULY 1 AT 6:00 PM IN THE GOVERNMENT CENTER FIRST FLOOR MEETING ROOM



During the meeting, city planning staff will present proposed amendments aimed at improving residential design standards and clarifying regulations. Topics will include:

• **Setback Encroachments:** Updated regulations for how far structures can extend into required yard setbacks.



• Fence Standards: Clarifying the design,

height, and placement of residential fencing.

• Minimum Landscape Requirements: New standards to enhance landscaping and promote greener neighborhoods.

This is a valuable opportunity to ask questions, provide feedback, and stay informed about changes that may impact future residential projects. We encourage everyone with an interest in local development to attend and participate.

Mayor's Mentoring Circle

I'm excited to share an update on the Mayor's Mentoring Circle, a hands-on program for teens that just wrapped up its latest session. Nine teens completed this free, eight-week program, where they met with me, to gain practical skills for their next steps. The session ends with the school year, and I'm now gearing up for a summer mini session starting in July.

This session, we focused on real-world tools: writing resumes, applying to magnet programs, landing internships, and gaining hands-on work experience. The teens also learned how to find references, communicate professionally with adults, and follow business etiquette.

I brought in successful business and community leaders to share tips, had former mentees talk about their paths, and practiced problem-solving through real-life scenarios. Meeting with this special constituency throughout the school year was fulfilling for me as well.

The upcoming summer mini session will keep the same practical focus and will be limited to eight teens to ensure personalized attention. Parents, to get your teen approved, text me at 917.751.1565. Spots are first-come, first-served, and this program is 100% free.

- Building resumes that stand out
- Applying to magnet programs and internships
- Gaining hands-on work experience
- Finding and securing references
- Professional communication and workplace etiquette
- Problem-solving for real-world challenges
- Talks from business leaders and past mentees

The Mentoring Circle is about giving teens the tools they need to succeed right now. The summer session will offer more of the same: direct guidance, actionable skills, and a small group setting.

Together, we will continue building a city government that reflects the best of Sunny Isles Beach: smart, efficient, and responsive to the people it serves.

Commission Recap

Below are some of the key approvals and decisions made by the City Commission at the May 15, 2025 meeting. For the full agenda and meeting recordings, visit sibfl.gov/meetings.

Additional Red-Light Cameras

The City Commission approved the addition of four red-light cameras at the following intersections:

- Collins Avenue & 174 Street (northbound and southbound)
- Collins Avenue & Sunny Isles Boulevard (northbound and southbound)

Flood Damage Prevention

The City Commission approved the first reading of an ordinance amending its floodplain management regulations to maintain eligibility for the National Flood Insurance Program's Community Rating System (CRS) Class 8 rating, which provides flood insurance premium discounts to residents. The revised ordinance requires that all manufactured homes and similar structures such as sales trailer and construction sites offices, which are placed, replaced, or substantially improved within Special Flood Hazard Areas be elevated, in accordance with updated federal standards. A second reading will take place at the June City Commission meeting.
